What is Renasight™?

Renasight is a test done on a saliva or blood sample to see if there is a genetic cause for your kidney condition, or to understand if you may be at increased risk for developing kidney disease due to your family history. Results from the test can provide information to better manage your disease. Early detection can help provide management strategies for you and your family and, in some cases, slow the progression of kidney disease.¹

What does Renasight test for?

Renasight tests over 380 genes that were chosen based on scientific evidence and their association with kidney disease.² Renasight tests for a wide variety of conditions from common inherited kidney disorders and those that are more rare.

What are the benefits of testing for kidney disease?

The more you and your physician know about the genetic cause of your kidney disease, the better prepared you'll both be to make healthcare decisions for you and your family members.

Identify the underlying cause of your kidney disease and its progression



Gain insights into personalized care options such as guidance on medication, early treatment, and referral to other specialists

What do Renasight results tell me?

Renasight test results are available in approximately three weeks.

Results from Renasight will show whether a disease-causing or likely disease-causing variant (change within the gene) has been detected for a specific condition(s). Results can provide valuable information for your care.
