Ask if it could be IgA Nephropathy


(pronounced "nuh-FROP-uh-thee")

- IgA Nephropathy, or IgAN for short, is an autoimmune disease that attacks the kidneys.
- IgA builds up in the kidney's filters and can:
 - Harm the kidneys' ability to do their job
 - Cause inflammation and irreversible kidney damage
- IgAN often goes undetected, which means delays in treatment and declines in kidney function
